

EAST WHITELAND TOWNSHIP  
Town Hall Meeting  
May 6, 2009

Vice Chair, William Holmes called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. John Mott, Member, and Terry Woodman, Township Manager, were present. Virginia McMichael joined the meeting at 7:13p.m. Five (5) people were in the audience and they were: Andrea Schram, Fahnestock Road, Water Lynn and Virginia Lynn, Old Lancaster and Warren Avenue, Brad Bradley and Tina McQueen, Warren Avenue.

Topics discussed included:

- Televised Board Meetings – frequently the question being asked by someone in attendance cannot be heard on the tape. After discussion, Mr. Holmes suggested that a Board member repeat the question to make sure a microphone picks it up.
- In response to a question about the status of the Pennsylvania Avenue extension, it was explained that a grant to conduct a feasibility study has just been awarded by the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission and the study should start this summer. The audience was also told that this study has being initiated by Malvern Borough and East Whiteland partnered with the Borough to help with the grant application.
- Question about plans for the renovation of the Malvern Train Station. Since that is located in the Borough, Ms. Woodman volunteered to contact the Borough and get a status report.
- Board members responded to general questions about the Uptown Worthington project.
- Walter Lynn discussed more frequent flooding at the intersection of Warren and Old Lancaster and suggested different style inlets to help alleviated the situation.
- Walter Lynn said it appears that someone is replacing old pipes near a stone house up by Pennsylvania Avenue and asked if the Board had any knowledge of the project. The Board said the project was not in East Whiteland and asked Ms. Woodman to check into it.
- Mr. Lynn asked questions about the availability of the Board’s agenda prior to meetings and when the minutes are uploaded on the website. Discussion ensued about an email distribution list that is in the design stage that would allow residents to sign up and receive emails from the Township, including agendas, directly.
- Virginia Lynn raised concern about large trees being cut down and discussion ensued regarding Radnor Township and their Shade Tree Commission which reviews applications for tree removal.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
